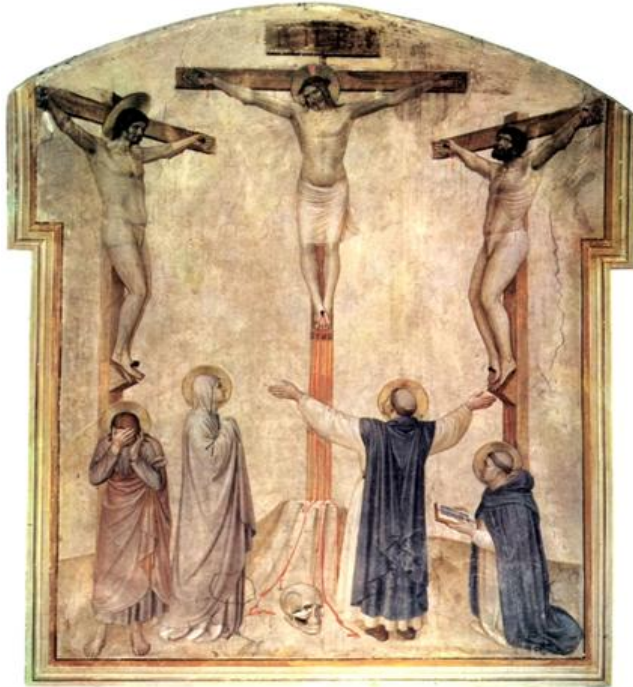

THE FIRST READING

Isaiah 52:13-53:12

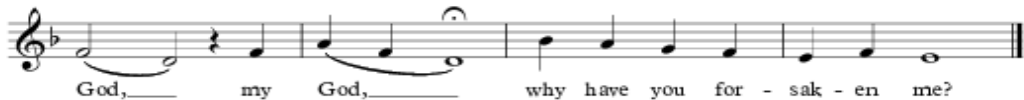
Reader: A reading from the book of Isaiah

At the end of the reading,

Reader: The word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

PSALM 22



The psalm refrain is sung once by the cantor and is then repeated by the congregation.

- (1) My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?
- (2) and are so far from my cry and from the words of my distress?
- (3) O my God, I cry in the daytime, but you do not answer;
- (4) by night as well, but I find no rest. **Refrain.**
- (1) Yet you are the Holy One,
- (2) enthroned upon the praises of Israel.
- (1) Our forebears put their trust in you;
- (2) they trusted, and you delivered them.
- (3) They cried out to you and were delivered;
- (4) they trusted in you and were not put to shame. **Refrain.**
- (1) But as for me, I am a worm and worthless, scorned by all and despised by the people. (2) All who see me laugh me to scorn; they curl their lips and wag their heads, saying,
- (3) "You trusted in God; let God deliver you,
- (4) rescue you, and show delight in you." **Refrain.**
- (1) Yet you, O God, are the one who took me from the womb,
- (2) and kept me safe upon my mother's breast.
- (3) I have been entrusted to you ever since I was born;
- (4) you were my God when I was still in my mother's womb. **Refrain.**
- (1) Be not far from me, for trouble is near,
- (2) and there is none to help.
- (3) Many young bulls encircle me; strong bulls of Bashan surround me.
- (4) They open wide their jaws at me, like a ravening and a roaring lion. **Refrain.**
- (1) I am poured out like water; all my bones are out of joint;
- (2) my heart within my breast is melting wax.
- (3) My mouth is dried out like a pot-sherd; my tongue sticks to the roof of my mouth;
- (4) and you have laid me in the dust of the grave. **Refrain.**
- (1) Packs of dogs close in on me,
- (2) and gangs of evildoers circle around me;
- (1) they pierce my hands and my feet;
- (2) I can count all my bones.
- (3) They stare and gloat over me; they divide my garments among them;
- (4) they cast lots for my clothing. **Refrain.**

- (1) Be not far away, O God;
- (2) you are my strength; hasten to help me.
- (1) Save me from the sword,
- (2) my life from the power of the dog.
- (3) Save me from the lion's mouth,
- (4) my wretched body from the horns of wild bulls. **Refrain.**

THE SECOND READING

Hebrews 4:14-16, 5:7-9

Reader: A reading from the letter to the Hebrews.

At the end of the reading

Reader: The word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

Please remain seated.

THE HOLY GOSPEL

John 18:1-19:42

Gospeller: The Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

NOTE: Throughout Christian history, references to “the Jews” in scripture—particularly in John and Acts—have been used to perpetuate negative stereotypes and falsely assign blame for the death of Jesus. These references gloss over significant distinctions among religious leaders, such as Pharisees, scribes, and Sadducees, and obscure the fact that Jesus and his disciples were themselves Jews.

As Christians, we confess and lament the history of anti-Judaism associated with these texts. We renounce the evils of violence and discrimination against Jewish people. We strive for mutual understanding, respect, and partnership with Jewish neighbours and commit ourselves to the work of reconciliation among people of all faiths.

Presider: Gracious God, the comfort of all who sorrow
for the sake of him who suffered for us, your Son, Jesus
Christ our Lord.

People: Amen.

Lay Reader: Let us pray for all who have not received the gospel of
Christ:
Pray now for all who have not received the gospel of Christ.

Silence

Presider: Merciful God, creator of the peoples of the earth and lover of
souls
under one shepherd, Jesus Christ our Lord.

People: Amen.

Lay Reader: Let us commit ourselves to God, and pray for the grace of a
holy life
.....
Pray now that we receive God's grace.

Silence

Presider: O God of unchangeable power and eternal light,
.....
in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

People: Amen.

*A wooden cross is processed to the front of the church. The procession stops
three times, with the presider singing the following and the congregation
responding.*

THE VENERATION OF THE CROSS

The congregation is invited to come forward in turn to venerate the cross – to stand or kneel before the cross and pray – while the following anthem is sung.

ANTHEM 1

Trisagion #707 (Refrain)

Ho - ly God, ho - ly and migh - ty,

ho - ly im - mor - tal one, have mer - cy up - on us.

The refrain is sung once by the cantor and is then repeated by the congregation.

BAS, pg 314

O my people, O my Church, What have I done to you, or in what have I offended you? Testify against me. I led you forth from the land of Egypt, and delivered you by the waters of baptism, but you have prepared a cross for your Saviour. **Refrain.**

I led you through the desert forty years, and fed you with manna. I brought you through tribulation and penitence, and gave you my body, the bread of heaven, but you have prepared a cross for your Saviour. **Refrain.**

What more could I have done for you that I have not done? I planted you, my chosen and fairest vineyard, I made you the branches of my vine; but when I was thirsty, you gave me vinegar to drink, and pierced with a spear the side of your Saviour. **Refrain.**

I went before you in a pillar of cloud, and you have led me to the judgement hall of Pilate. I scourged your enemies and brought you to a land of freedom, but you have scourged, mocked, and beaten me. I gave you the water of salvation from the rock, but you have given me gall and left me to thirst. **Refrain.**

I gave you a royal sceptre, and bestowed the keys to the kingdom, but you have given me a crown of thorns. I raised you on high with great power, but you have hanged me on the cross. **Refrain.**

My peace I gave, which the world cannot give, and washed your feet as a sign of my love, but you draw the sword to strike in my name, and seek high places in my kingdom. I offered you my body and blood, but you scatter and deny and abandon me. **Refrain.**

I sent the Spirit of truth to guide you, and you close your hearts to the Counsellor. I pray that all may be as one in the Father and me, but you continue to quarrel and divide. I call you to go and bring forth fruit, but you cast lots for my clothing. **Refrain**

I grafted you into the tree of my chosen Israel, and you turned on them with persecution and mass murder. I made you joint heirs with them of my covenants, but you made them scapegoats for your own guilt. **Refrain.**

I came to you as the least of your brothers and sisters; I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me no drink, I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not clothe me, sick and in prison and you did not visit me. **Refrain**
